#### 2. Summary

Natalie Hami and Fanny Cheyrou chose to explore how young people in both Cyprus and France felt about the EU and its future, as well as the recent MEP elections in their respective countries. They concluded that even though some very much believe in the institution that is the EU many feel that they don't see any direct impact from being in the EU. There is also a lot of indifference to the EU expressed by young people in both countries.

#### 3. Dissemination of the Output

The output will be first of all disseminated by web radio on a show which is part of the Cyprus Community Media Centre. There are also plans to have it translated into French and Greek and have either all or parts of it published in various national newspapers such as La Croix, the Cyprus Mail and Politis newspaper. A suggestion was also made by a political figure in Cyprus to have it disseminated to all the island's political parties.
