- Funded by EC Safer Internet Action Plan
- In 1999 there were 10 member hotlines today there are 28


Mission Statement

Internet Hotlines

- Offer an easy way for the public to report suspected illegal sites and content
- Effective response to cross-border criminal activity
- Each report is reviewed by a content analyst and origin on the internet is traced
- Action is taken to ensure swift response
 - > Referred to local or international law enforcement
 - ➤ Referred to INHOPE hotline in country of origin
 - > Referred to ISP for appropriate action


Real people... response has to be fast


Key Challenges for INHOPE


- Managing cultural and legislative differences

- Building strong strategic alliances with key stakeholders





