Few Remarks on the UN CRC

- ✓ Not only *quantitatively* but also *qualitatively* different from earlier international agreement
- ✓ The twofold nature of the UN CRC
 - ✓ The Descriptive
 - ✓ The Normative (dynamic)
- ✓ *Culturally sensitive* and thus flexible within the limits of the basic principle of the "best interest of the child"

CoE Achievments: Standard Setting for Enhancing the Rights of Children

- ✓ Translating/Operationalizing the Rights into the different context in the life of children such as:
 - ✓ Institutions, Rec (2005)5
 - ✓ Family environment; Rec (2006)19
 - ✓ Judicial system; the Guidelines 2010
 - ✓ Social services; Rec (2011)12
 - ✓ Health Care; Guidelines 2011
 - ✓ Participation in Society; Rec (2012)2

The Lanzarote Convention

- ✓ Unique among International Agreements
- ✓ Basic characteristics:
 - ✓ Child-friendly
 - Comprehensive
 - ✓ In terms of scope
 - ✓ In terms of content
 - ✓ Interdisciplinary/Multiagency
 - Proactive

Child-friendly

The goal is to identify child-friendly strategies and practices to ensure:

- ✓ The "best interests of the child" without compromising the human right principle:
- ✓ The "due process" (fair trial)

Comprehensive

- ✓ In terms of definition as it addresses child sexual abuse and sexual exploitation in all it's forms including:
 - child prostitution, trafficking, pornography, solicitation, corruption as well as sexual abuse within or outside of the family
- ✓ In terms of coverage:
 - ✓ Prevention, Protection, Prosecution

Interdisciplinary; Multi-agency

- ✓ Proposes a holistic and non-fragmented approach by inter-sectoral coordination, agency cooperation and diversified professional collaboration in terms of:
 - Prevention
 - ✓ Protection by effective response, assessment and appropriate intervention
 - ✓ Investigation, Prosecution and Judgement

Proactive

✓ Identifies the infrastructure and legal provisions to ensure appropriate social protection from child sexual abuse and exploitation

As well as:

✓ Proposes principles that reflect dynamic implementation by articulated standard setting and strategies


The Lanzarote Committee

- ✓ The dual role of the Committee of Parties
- ✓ Monitoring
 - ✓ Facilitate the effective use of the different provisions of the Convention, identification of any problems and express an opinion on the application
- ✓ Observatory
 - ✓ Facilitate the collection, analysis and exchange of information on legal, policy and technological development
 - ✓ General comments, proposals and opinions

Strategies of Monitoring

- ✓ General overview:
 - ✓ With regard to general legal and institutional framework and policies
- ✓ Thematic Monitoring
 - ✓ Procedure is divided by rounds, each round addresses a particular "theme"
- ✓ The first theme: "Sexual Abuse in the Circle of Trust"

Implementation of the monitoring

- ✓ All parties to the Convention should undergo monitoring within 3 months from the adoption of the Questionnaire
- ✓ The Questionnaire is also submitted to rep. of civil society, NGO or other relevant bodies
- ✓ Transparency of the procedure by making the reply's public
- ✓ Ad hoc working groups, independent experts, visits for the purpose of clarification

Implementation Reports

- ✓ "Thematic Reports; based on the parties replies containing:
 - ✓ General description
 - ✓ Identification of problems
 - Recommendations for improvements
- ✓ Special Reports
 - ✓ Response to reliable information pertaining to serious violation of the Convention

Monitoring Outcomes – positive actions

- Enhancing knowledge and awareness among
 Governments and societies at large
- ✓ Strengthening Prevention and Early detection
- ✓ Creating Child-friendly Response System
 - ✓ Preventing re-victimisation
- ✓ Ensuring appropriate therapeutic services for child victims and their families
- ✓ Sex offender intervention, criminal and therapeutic
