## The Children's Ombudsperson – Promoting and Protecting the Rights and Interests of Children in Society

- Child Participation Principle one of the guiding principles of the Convention on the Rights of the Child
- Article 7 of the Ombudsman for Children Act
- The Ombudsman for Children ... has a primary responsibility to advise children of their rights and teach them how to exercise and protect their rights and interests.
- The role of the Ombudsman for Children ... is to work with children, encourage them to express their views aand give their views due consideration,... The Ombudsman for Children proposes steps to increase children's influence in society.

# What Do Children Think? Ways to Encourage Children To Express Their Views

- Visiting children at schools, kindergartens, homes for children ...
- Children visiting the Office of Children's Ombudsperson
- Enhancing the participation of children and young people in policy formation through delivery of a range of different focus group consultation sessions

### **FOCUS GROUP**

## Age of Consent to any form of sexual activity as set out in the Criminal Code

- Further to a discussion that took place at the Office of Children's Ombudsperson, high school students who participated in one of the focus groups became interested in the topic of the minimum age at which a child may legally consent to sexual intercourse with an adult (the age of consent is set to 14 years).
- They suggested that a survey should be conducted among students at their schools (students across 4 secondary schools in Zagreb participated in the survey).

### Network of Young Advisors (NYA)-Giving Children a Stronger Voice in Society!

In Spring 2010 preparations for the establishment of an advisory body – comprised entirely of children – to the Children's Ombudsperson were already underway.

The formal founding meeting of the NYA was held in Autumn 2010; they chose the name by themselves

### NYA – The Network of Young Advisors

- Online forum children exchanging opinions and ideas
- Follow-up survey regarding the age of consent
- Consultation sessions with a focus on specific topics of concern or interest to children and young people


### **YOUTH SURVEY:**

### Legal Age of Consent to Sexual Activity

A survey among 2500 high school students in Zagreb, Split, Osijek and Rijeka (2010).

Survey results show that 94.68% of respondents believe that the age of consent of 14 is too low:

- •45.72% 16 years
- •22.48% 17 years
- •17.52% 18 years
- •8.96% 15 years
- •5.32% 14 years



# WHAT WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED SO FAR Shared responsibility: Achievements and Successes Through Joint Efforts

- Changes to the Criminal Code have raised the age of consent for sexual activity to 15
- The children (members of the NYA) could see for themselves the immediate and positive results from their efforts, but also realized that it is a time-consuming and toilsome process.
- Partnership with children to promote violence prevention.

The Women's World Summit Foundation,

launched a campaign to promote the prevention of child abuse.

The WWSF decided to award prizes for innovative child abuse prevention programs.

We joined the campaign by arranging meetings with students and expert debates; constructing media messages; issuing publications for children and adults; creating a culture of prevention and raising awareness about child abuse prevention in society.

Our Office was awarded first prize for an innovative approach to child abuse prevention by the WWSF.



#### children's PARTICIPATION

- The award was accompanied by a cash prize; we decided to donate this award as a way to give back to design students at the Graphic Design Department at the School of Applied Arts and Design in Zagreb
- Partnership to prevent violence against children through discussions and awareness-raising events
- They created visual and verbal messages targeting not only young people, but also adults. Using visual and verbal means of communication they delivered a familiar message:

### What have we learned?

- We must not be afraid that children would find us boring
- We are "allowed" to bring up topics for discussion that children would never come up with themselves
- We do not need to choose a discussion topic close to their heart
- We should not avoid difficult difficult topics
- Conversations and debates provide valuable insight into children's attitudes and perceptions (even though we may disagree with their opinions)

### What we have yet to learn

- How to find the right balance between offering some guidance and encouragement to children and allowing them the freedom to take initiative?
- How to balance our need to protect children and our commitment to increase children's influence on decisionmaking?
- How to respond fast enough to children's evolving ideas?
- How to encourage children to contact us to seek protection of their rights?

 We learned <u>never to assume</u> that we know all about children's needs and interests.
