A Pompidou Group initiative where participation of children and young people is fundamental

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The Pompidou Group

(Co-operation Group to Combat Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking in Drugs)

- is an intergovernmental body formed in 1971 at the suggestion of the French President Georges Pompidou
- at first, the Pompidou Group was an informal co-operation forum of 7 European countries (France, Belgium, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, United Kingdom) looking to share their experience of combating drug abuse and drug trafficking.
- was incorporated into the Council of Europe in 1980
- the co-operation was subsequently extended to include new countries; at present, the Pompidou Group comprises 35 member states.







The Role of the Pompidou Group

- core mission = contribute to the development of multidisciplinary, innovative, effective and "evidence-based" drug policies in 35 member states.
- it seeks to link policy, practice and science
- it provides a **multidisciplinary forum** at the wider European level where it is possible for policy-makers, professionals and researchers **to discuss and exchange information and ideas** on the whole range of drug misuse and trafficking problems.
- it plays a **bridging role** between EU countries and non-EU countries (Life skills programme in Ukraine; co-operation network with Mediterranean Region (MedNet))







The Structure of the Pompidou Group

- Secretariat (12 persons) is based in Strasbourg
- Ministerial Conference (every 4 years) -> adopt work programme
- Permanent correspondents = representatives of the 35 member states;
 senior officials in ministries in charge of drug issues (2 meetings / year)
- Since 2003, 6 platforms (group of experts) looking at issues concerning:
 - → Prevention seeking innovative, evidence based practises
 - → Treatment improving treatment for specific groups, adapting to new trends
 - → Research support better use of research evidence in policy and practice
 - → Ethics devising guidelines and setting standards in addressing drug-related ethical issues
 - → Criminal justice co-operation between law enforcement, health/care and social services
 - → Airports & aviation harmonising procedures to improve the efficiency of controls in European airports







The Prevention platform

- identify new approaches and technologies in achieving more effective and widespread impact with prevention efforts
- nature of prevention = multi-faceted -> activities are carried out through a number of different projects focusing on local realities (...)
- identify specific trends and needs as well as the most effective, practical solutions
- bring about more targeted and effective prevention







The European Drug Prevention Prize - A concrete example of youth participation

- It serves as a window to exceptional grass-root projects
- Encourages young jurors to assume their responsibility (entrusted with the decision-making)
- 2006 Ministerial Conference: wish to encourage and promote youth participation in drug prevention + organisation of the Prize approved
- 2008 Mid-term conference: need for tools better drug prevention was raised; after award ceremony, many delegations showed interest in the Prize
- Strong political support BUT there is also need for financial support







The European Drug Prevention Prize



- Created in 2004 to recognise the importance of active youth participation in creating a better environment
- Awarded every two years -> 2004, 2006, 2008 and next 2010
- 3 active youth drug prevention projects rewarded (except in 2006, only two projects were rewarded)
- Now 5000 € monetary benefit, trophy and diploma

Objective: promote youth involvement in drug prevention

- brings added value
- youth not only has the right to participate they have a right to say and decide for themselves
- they are the experts on youth issues
- they know better what message is effective
- they also learn a lot from participating in decision-making meetings

Young people bring a 4th dimension into the work of the Pompidou Group: we already work with policy makers, researchers/scientists and professionals (practitioners, social workers, etc.)







Pompidou Group's methodology



- select jurors (gender balance and geographical representation)
- raise the jurors' awareness on values (Council of Europe, Pompidou Group, drug prevention)
- train the jury on project evaluation



- Stimulate exchange of ideas
- encourage their autonomy in the decision-making process
- Support the work plan the jurors have set up
- Involve the jurors and the projects in the follow up
