WHAT ARE THE ADVANTAGES OF CONCLUDING A BILATERAL AGREEMENT?



Both states want that there citizens are still protected for social security matters if they move or travel from one country to another



Guarantee:

- that we keep our long term benefits
- that we can easily enter in the social system of the other country
- that in case of a temporary stay and sometimes of residence in the other country we maintain the advantages of the whole system
