

Progress re. social protection - Candidates



Croatia

- Ongoing reforms in the pension and health care systems
- Universal coverage and adequacy of pensions not yet ensured
- Large number of women of pensionable age not receiving pensions

Progress re. social protection - Candidates



fYR of Macedonia

- Three pillars of the pension system now operational
- Amendments to the Law on pensions and disability
- Insufficient administrative capacity to develop a sustainable and equitable social security system

Progress re. social protection - Candidates



Turkey

- Social Insurance and General Health Insurance Law entered into force in October 2008
- Social Security Institution: strengthened capacity, one-stop shops
- No development as regards new legislation on social assistance and services



Albania

- Social protection and social inclusion strategy for 2008-2013 adopted
- Inspectorate of Social Services set up
- ★ Efforts to improve the financial sustainability of the social insurance scheme
- Improved procedures for pensions and soc. sec.
- Work started on a centralised digital social security archive



Bosnia and Herzegovina

- No harmonised social security system due to extreme fragmentation of institutional and legislative frameworks
- Improved decision-making and coordination in the field of public health
- ★ Some progress on statistical reporting (Republika)

 Srpska)



Kosovo (under UNSCR 1244/99)

- Social protection system financially unsustainable and not organised efficiently
- No adequate IT mechanism for monitoring
- Amendments to the pension scheme
- Social security system remains cash-based
- No health insurance fund
- Health sector is very poor



Montenegro

- Strategies 2008-2012 adopted (child protection, elderly, disabled) but weak implementation
- Little progress on public health policy
- Some legislation introduced towards EU alignment



Serbia

- Decentralisation of social protection system initiated but weak implementation due to lack of resources
- Single system for pensions established
- Ongoing reform of the health insurance system:
 - IT capacity strengthened
 - Awareness-raising campaigns
- Insufficient capacity and funding in the public health sector
